

Glory be to Him Who was hanged upon the Cross, by which He freed creation... by which the power of death was totally negated... by which our debts and sins may be forgiven... (From the Syriac Maronite Prayers for the Feast of the Holy Cross)

In just this short quote from our traditional prayers for the Feast of the Holy Cross it is clear how important the cross is – it is the instrument by which Christ freed all creation from Satan, destroyed the power of death and is used for the forgiveness of sins. The question is how and why does the Cross have this importance?

As St. Paul recounts in chapter 9 of the Letter to the Hebrews, Christ prepared the Jewish people for His coming by instituting the Temple system – for the forgiveness of sins, people needed to offer animal sacrifices often and always. The following of Temple rules built devotion to God, granted specific forgiveness of sins, and helped prepare an understanding of sacrifice. But the acts of men, even just men, could never take away the damage that existed in the world from sin since the time of Adam. No simple human could forgive or destroy sin and death, which abounds in the world since Adam's transgression.

St. Paul says in the same chapter that the true High Priest, Jesus Christ, entered the sanctuary "not made by hands" and offered the perfect sacrifice once and for all. No man could erase the sin of Adam, but Jesus Christ was God and He offered the perfect sacrifice of Himself – He, God, offered the sacrifice of the flesh and blood of the incarnate God! The Creator and Giver of Life sacrificed Himself, Who is life, for the life of the world. Of course, this sacrifice was so great that it overcame death itself and destroyed it. The altar of His sacrifice was not the Temple in Jerusalem but the Cross, where He died.

When the Temple was destroyed, it radically changed the Jewish religion which depended on it as a place of sacrifice for the forgiveness of sins; until this day, the Jewish people do not have a place to offer sacrifice to

praise God or remit sins. But it should be no surprise that the destruction of the Temple in the 1st century posed no problem for Christianity – in fact, many Church Fathers said it was a divine sign that Judaism had been fulfilled since the perfect sacrifice for the remission of our sins was offered by Christ on the Cross.

Upon the Cross, God sacrificed His own flesh and blood, foreshadowed at the Last Supper, to free creation from the power of sin and death. The Cross was the altar of Jesus Christ, the true High Priest. This place of the perfect sacrifice and its power Christ has given to the Church for its use. Wherever it is found, the Cross is not only a reminder but the presence of this saving power. It is the sign by which the priests complete the sacraments. And whomever signs himself with the Cross invokes the whole life-giving power of the sacrifice of God and its power to crush death and sin.

May Your saving and life-giving Cross be for us a fortress and unconquerable armor against all adverse power which evilly plots against Your Faithful Church, redeemed by Your precious blood, that through its power we may be protected, triumph and be rescued from all violence and calumny of demons and oppressive men. In You, O God Who were crucified, we shall take refuge while worshipping and glorifying Your salvation, now and at all times, forever. Amen.


