

Reflection

Finding God in Nature

The first thing I did after leaving my previous assignment at St. Elias was go on retreat. I think it's important whenever we go through a big transition to check in with God and make sure we can hear Him throughout the process. The location I chose for the retreat was Crater Lake National Park. I stayed at the lodge on the rim of the caldera of an ancient volcano which had collapsed and turned into a lake. There are no rivers in or out of the lake. It's water comes from rain and snow-melt. It is pure, crystalline, even mirror-like on particularly still mornings. On my retreat I was alone with the lake. Each day I would wake up, offer a liturgy, arm myself with bear spray, and hike the steep snowy ledges of the volcano.

On the first day, it felt like a bit of a drag. Every hike was grueling because the ground was still covered in 7 feet of snow. However, by the third day, I noticed a change in my psyche. I could sleep easier, I felt more energized, and I was getting a kind of emotional high. My attention span increased so much that I found myself sitting on a rocking chair by the lake doing nothing but staring at its waters for an hour straight. What a contrast from how I was just a few days ago being too impatient to sit through a 30 second, action-packed youtube short. Additionally, my prayer life deepened. I found it easier to talk to God and when I did, I felt like He was listening.

The experience reminded me of an important theological truth. One of the primary ways we encounter God is through nature. It is true that Divine Revelation is Jesus Christ revealed through Scripture and Tradition, but there is another form of revelation. We might call that *natural* revelation: God revealed through nature. In the same way that we learn about an artist through his artwork, an author through his writing, and a master chef through his cooking, we can learn about God through His creation. There is a reason why great saints like Sharbel and Hardini chose to live on top of beautiful mountains with incredible views. For these saints, to see the beauty of creation was to see the face of God.

There is a special benefit to encountering God through nature. When we slow down and take time to appreciate His creation, we put our soul in the palm of God's hand and allow him to change us. We don't really have to do anything but surrender to Him, and we start to see the effects of His natural beauty on our minds and our hearts. God's beauty is like a medicine that works effectively and immediately. Hopefully we can all come to learn what it means to encounter God through nature. Especially since, as residents of the Pacific Northwest, we are living in one of the most beautiful places on earth.
